XII. 150th ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION

XV. COORDINATING TEAM

Coordinating Team Chair Maribeth Culpepper was not able to be present because of knee surgery. Nelson Capitan presented the CT report on behalf of Maribeth. Presbytery **APPROVED** the following Revised Proposed Covenant Presbyterian Church Overture to the Presbytery of Santa Fe

There are times in the life of the corporate church, as it seeks to follow the Great Ends of the Church, when (1) the proclamation of the gospel for the salvation of humankind, (2) the promotion of social righteousness, and (3) the exhibition of the Kingdom of Heaven to the world call us to testify by speaking publicly. Beyond the venue of acting through a presbytery meeting, the Presbytery of Santa Fe therefore authorizes the Coordinating Team (CT) to speak on the presbytery's behalf without calling a presbytery meeting, with these stipulations:

A. If the Presbytery or a higher governing council has already made a statement on the issue at hand, and the CT's proclamation would be in keeping with those previous statements, a simple majority of CT could approve the drafting of a public position.

B. If there is no previous statement on a subject by the Presbytery or higher governing councils, it would require a 2/3 majority of CT to draft such a statement.

C. If a statement is drafted it should express theological imperatives of Reformed faith as expressed in Scripture and reflected in our confessions.

Once CT has approved the statement by the above stipulations, the Moderator and the Stated Clerk would be instructed and authorized to sign the statement on behalf of the Presbytery.

The Presbytery of Santa Fe is blessed with rich diversity – race, gender, abilities/limitations, ethnicity, age, theological conviction, and political persuasion. While we are one in Christ Jesus, we have a variety of characteristics, and a single statement issued by the presbytery may not reflect the convictions of all members or congregations. Accordingly, if the CT opts to issue a public statement, it will provide electronic notification to all members of the presbytery (including active and retired) Ministers of Word and Sacrament, moderators of session, and clerks of session at least 24 hours in advance of release of such a statement. Individual congregations in the presbytery or members of the presbytery may wish to make a simultaneous public statement. In such cases we would be openly affirming and validating our corporate diversity.

We acknowledge that individual congregations and/or Ministers of the Word and Sacrament may choose on occasion to make a public expression of their respective convictions, with Ministers of Word and Sacrament identifying themselves as ordained within the PCUSA.

Committee Members

There are six existing members of this committee: Marty Bruner, Lou Ann Johnson, Ginna Bairby, Maribeth Culpepper, Jane Moses and me, Ruth Montoya. (David Kirby relocated out of state in mid-year; two others resigned).

Scope of our Work:

Beginning in February, the committee met monthly to assure we had a complete slate of candidates for election at the 2018 fall meeting of the Presbytery. With support and suggestions from throughout the church, we were able to identify names of potential candidates who, in turn, agreed to place their name in nomination for various committees and commissions. We made a concerted effort to keep true to our Mission: "To assure that the Presbytery is served by the best and widest representation possible, while encouraging participation in the ministry, mission and work of the Presbytery by qualified persons from throughout the Presbytery."

Our Goals

Morning vespers were offered at 7:00 a.m. outside the Agape Center by MWS Ken Cuthbertson, Parish Associate at Las Placitas and HR.

The meeting was reconvened with prayer and gathering music at 9:00 a.m. in the Agape Center J. Herbert Nelson, Stated Clerk of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) was to address the Presbytery of Santa Fe this morning, but due to a family emergency had to leave. The Presbytery prayed for J. Herbert Nelson and his family.

RULES OF DECORUM

Enabling Motions:

- 1. That these be the guidelines for the conducting of business at this meeting:
 - a. Out of courtesy, when Presbytery is debating, all remarks shall be addressed to the moderator and shall be made from the floor.
 - b. In the interest of time and to allow as many as possible to speak, speeches will be strictly limited to 2 minutes. Persons wishing to speak should move to the appropriate microphone. So there is clarity, a speaker should begin by saying,

- "I speak for (or against) the amendment..." The moderator will rotate between calling on a person in favor, and then a person opposed, etc.
- c. Remarks shall be confined to the pending question. The moderator will interrupt if in his/her judgment the speaker has drifted from the pending question.
- d. Commissioners may not refer adversely to prior acts of Presbytery not pending now.
- e. Remarks shall not impugn another commissioner or that person's motives.
- f. Distribution of reports or documents shall not be done during the meeting.
- g. Commissioners shall not disturb the meeting, by applause or verbal response to remarks made by a commissioner, or in response to a vote.
- h. Each commissioner may speak twice on a subject but may not speak the second time until everyone who wishes has spoken.

IV. ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF WHOSE LAND WE ARE MEETING ON

Moderator-Elect Seth Finch read the following statement written by moderator Jane Stringfellow acknowledging whose land we are meeting on.

Traveling south on I-25 from Santa Fe to Albuquerque this morning, I passed by the Cochiti Reservation and drove through the Santo Domingo, San Felipe, Santa Ana and Sandia Reservations. I have made this drive hundreds of times, but in the last year, when I learned for the first time about the Doctrine of Discovery, driving through these reservations has an entirely new meaning for me. I am both saddened and humbled by the cruelty of my European ancestors, but I have a new-found respect for the indigenous peoples that were the original inhabitants of our state as well as a sincere respect and love for those of you whom I have gotten to know because our paths have crossed in a very personal way due to our work together on behalf of the Presbytery of Santa Fe.

So, I begin our meeting today by acknowledging, with respect and humility, upon whose land we are gathered. Imagine yourself in a time machine that is propelling you way, way back in time at least 12,000 years. What do you see when you arrive? You observe Paleo-Indian hunter-gathers roaming the land upon which Albuquerque, NM was founded centuries later. Gradually, these nomadic people adopted a more agricultural life style and by 750 CE began to build multi-story stone or adobe dwellings, known as pueblos. The Albuquerque area was settled by the Tewa people beginning around 1250, and by the 1500s, there were around 20 Tewa pueblos along a 60-mile stretch of the middle Rio Grande valley. Surely, those of us gathered here at Immanuel Presbyterian Church stand upon hallowed ground, ground that belonged to the ancestors of our Native American friends and colleagues in the Presbytery of Santa Fe. Blessed be this ground and blessed be all peoples who have walked and who continue to walk upon it.

A Native American Wisdom Saying

Treat the earth well.

It was not given to you by your parents,
it was loaned to you by your children.

We do not inherit the Earth from our Ancestors,

we borrow it from our Children.

- 3) The Officers of the Board of Trustees shall be a President, who is the Moderator of the Presbytery; a Secretary, who is the Stated Clerk of the Presbytery; and a Treasurer, who is the Treasurer of the Presbytery.

The Presbytery ELECTED the following persons to serve as officers of the Corporation, The Presbytery of Santa Fe, a New Mexico Corporation, effective January 1, 2019: Elder Jane Stringfellow, President; Elder Bill Belvin, Treasurer; Elder Stephen Rhoades, Secretary

The Corporation ADJOURNED and RECONVENED as The Presbytery of Santa Fe, a mid council of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), with prayer.

XIII. FAITH SHARING

Moderator Elect Finch introduced MWS Asher Dean, who is joining as a member-at-large. He transferred his membership Sialkot Pakistan Presbytery. He shared some of his faith journey.

XIV. SHARING FROM OUR PARTNERS

Conrad Rocha shared news of the Synod of the Southwest. He acknowledged the gifts of the many members of the Presbytery of Santa Fe involved in Synod work. He then invited the Associate Stated Clerk/Executive Assistant Robin Thomas to come forward. She and her husband Ray Thomas are leaving to become the Co-Executive Presbyters of Middle Tennessee Presbytery. Morton Fund Loan administered by the Synod of the Southwest because this loan approval is a time sensitive issue and needs to be addressed now but does not warrant calling a special presbytery meeting.

IT IS, FURTHER, RESOLVED, that the Presbytery of Santa Fe shall assist First Presbyterian Church of Belen by signing the Presbytery Approval portion of the Claude L. Morton Fund loan application and be bound by those Presbytery Approval provisions.

IT IS, FINALLY, RESOLVED, that the Stated Clerk should be and hereby is authorized to sign the Presbytery Approval portion of the Claude L. Morton Fund loan application on behalf of the Presbytery.

This is a proposal to add to the duties of Moderator-Elect and possible successors to the Moderator-Elect in the "Officers" section of the Standing Rules at Line 175:

reason during the Moderator-Elect's term, the Moderator-Elect shall immediately, without the need for an election or installation, become Acting Moderator with all of the powers, duties and responsibilities of Moderator under the Book of Order and the Presbytery's Bylaws and Standing Rules until the next annual meeting of the Presbytery. The Presbytery may, but is not required to, elect and install a Successor Moderator-Elect, with all of the powers, duties and responsibilities of Moderator-Elect under the Presbytery's Bylaws and Standing Rules; or elect but not install an Acting Vice-Moderator, serving in any capacity requested by the Acting Moderator. Candidates for either office are presented to the Presbytery by the Committee on Representation and Participation and any such officer will serve until the next annual meeting of the Presbytery.

- e) As Moderator of Presbytery for any prior year.
- f) Moderator of Presbyterian Women if she is not otherwise a voting member of Presbytery.
- 2) <u>Corresponding Members.</u> When in attendance, corresponding members with voice, but without vote shall be:
 - a) Members of Synod Staff and Presbytery staff, and
 - b) Ministers of the Word and Sacrament of other Presbyteries of the PCUSA and of other communions in correspondence with the General Assembly.
- 3) Youth Advisory Delegates. Persons between 17 and 23 years of age, not otherwise serving as a Ruling Elder commissioner, may be elected by each Session for a term of one year. Youth advisory delegates must be active members of the particular congregation which elected them and are granted privilege of the floor, but without vote.
- 4) Others in Attendance. Others in attendance at a meeting of Presbytery may be granted privilege of the floor by action of Presbytery. Such persons should present their names to the Administrator prior to the opening of the particular Presbytery meeting.
- 5) <u>Judicial Process.</u> Full judicial process as defined in the Rules of Discipline of the Constitution of the PCUSA shall apply to all communicant members, Ministers of the Word and Sacrament, and corporations affiliated with and subject to the Constitution of the PCUSA.

ARTICLE V

The Presbytery as an Ecclesiastical Entity

- 1) The Presbytery, as an ecclesiastical body, shall consist of the following:
 - a. <u>Ecclesiastical Officers of Presbytery.</u> Presbytery elects as its ecclesiastical officers a Moderator, Moderator-elect, Past Moderator, Stated Clerk and Treasurer. Their duties are as stated in the Book of Order and the Standing Rules of the Presbytery of Santa Fe. The terms of office for the Moderator and Moderator-elect begin with their installation. The terms of office for the Stated Clerk and

Treasurer begin at the close of the Annual Meeting following election.

- i. The <u>Moderator</u> is ordinarily the person who has served as Moderator-elect the preceding year, and is elected for a term of one year.
- ii. The Moderator-elect is elected for a term of one year.
- iii. The Past Moderator is elected for a term of one year.
- iv. The Stated Clerk is elected for a term of three years.
- v. The <u>Treasurer</u> is elected for a term of three years.
- b. <u>Presbytery Commissions</u>, <u>Committees and Teams</u>. The Commissions and Committees of Presbytery shall be those created to fulfill the vision and values of the Presbytery and those required by the Constitution of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). They shall include: the Commission on Ministry; the Commission on Preparation for Ministry; the Committee on Representation and Participation; the Worship Networking Committee; the Education Networking Committee; the Mission Networking Committee; the Finance and Property Committee; the Personnel Committee; the Presbytery Permanent Judicial Commission; the Leadership Team; and the Coordinating Team.
 - i. <u>Responsibilities</u>. The responsibilities of these commissions, committees, and teams are set forth in the Book of Order and the Standing Rules of the Presbytery.

ii. Election.

- The members and chairpersons of all Commissions and Committees, except as otherwise noted in paragraphs 2 and 3 below, are nominated by the Committee on Representation and Participation and elected annually by the Presbytery.
- 2. The members of the Permanent Judicial Commission shall elect their own chairperson from among their membership.
- 3. The members of the Committee on Representation and Participation are nominated by the Coordinating Team and elected by the Presbytery. The chair shall be nominated from among the committee members by the Moderator of the Presbytery and elected annually by the



- Serving as chairperson of the Leadership Team.
 - Serving as President of the Board of Trustees.
 - Appointing, in consultation with the chairperson(s) of the Commission on Ministry, the Stated Clerk, and Associate Stated Clerk, a committee of counsel as provided in the Rules of Discipline D-6.0302. Further, the Moderator shall at the next meeting of the Presbytery report such action.
 - Appointing, with the advice and consent of the chairperson(s) of the Commission on Ministry and Stated Clerk, an investigating committee as provided in the Rules of Discipline D-10.0103. Further, the Stated Clerk shall at the next meeting of the Presbytery report such action.
 - Appointing, in consultation with the chairperson(s) of Commission on Ministry, the Stated Clerk and the Associate Stated Clerk, a committee for Special Administrative Review, as provided in the Book of Order G-3.0108b. Further, the Moderator shall at the next meeting of the Presbytery report such action.

Candidates for the office of Moderator are presented to the Presbytery by the Committee on Representation and Participation at the annual meeting of the Presbytery, and that officer is elected and ordinarily installed at that meeting.

The Moderator-Elect's duties are specified in the bylaws of the Presbytery, and as the Presbytery may otherwise direct, and include:

- Serving as the Vice-Moderator of the Presbytery.
- Serving on behalf of the Moderator in any capacity when invited by the Moderator.
- Serving as a member of the Coordinating Team.

In electing the Moderator-Elect, the Presbytery stipulates that the Moderator-Elect will become the Moderator the following year, and will serve a three-year term on the Leadership Team by virtue of office. Candidates for the office of Moderator-Elect are presented to the Presbytery by the Committee on Representation and Participation at the annual meeting of the Presbytery, and that officer is elected and ordinarily installed at that meeting.

The **Treasurer's** duties are specified in the Articles of Incorporation, the Bylaws of the Presbytery and relevant secular law. In addition, the duties of the Treasurer shall include:

- Providing a financial report at stated meetings of the Presbytery.
- Presenting a year-end financial statement to Presbytery at its first stated meeting following the end of the fiscal year.
- Working with the Leadership Team, the Finance and Property Committee, the Administrator, the Coordinating Team, and others on matters pertaining to the financial life of the Presbytery, which shall include an annual audit/review of the Presbytery's

MOTION: Establishment of an Administrative Commission for Camino de Vida:

- A. The Presbytery of Santa Fe (PCUSA) expresses delight at the opportunity to enter a dialogue with the leadership of Camino de Vida, our Lutheran partners in the Synod of the Rocky Mountains (ELCA), and Rev Guillermo Yela, to design a process to formally organize Camino de Vida as a United congregation of the PCUSA and the ELCA.
- B. In order to facilitate this process, the Presbytery of Santa Fe appoints an Administrative Commission composed of 6 members appointed by the moderator. The Commission will share a brief monthly report with Coordinating Team, Presbytery and COM.

The Commission is:

- 1) given the authority of Presbytery in all matters dealing with Camino de Vida as a New Church Development under direction of the *Book of Order* and supervision of the Presbytery of Santa Fe.
- to develop positive and supportive relationships with leaders of Camino de Vida, and assist with training and leadership development for future governing board members and other leaders.
- to provide opportunities to learn of the impact of the many cultural realities facing the peoples of Camino de Vida, along with the Presbyterian and Lutheran traditions in New Mexico,
- 4) to develop written agreements and a clear process and timeline with our Lutheran partners and the leadership of Camino de Vida to complete its formal organization as a united congregation of our two churches.
- C. The Presbytery of Santa Fe anticipates:
 - 1) that these agreements will be completed and presented to the Fall meeting of the Presbytery, 2020.
 - 2) that these agreements will include clarity on such issues as financial commitments of founding denominations, plans for congregational governance, formalization of regularizing and supervision of pastoral leadership and ministry in the united congregation, record keeping, and plans for reporting membership as required and distribution of mission support equally among the founding denominations, potential property matters, and other matters as they arise.

CHARGE TO ADMINISTRATIVE COMMISSION TO RATON, FIRST BACKGROUND

At the request of the Presbytery's Commission on Ministry, the Presbytery's Coordinating Team (CT), acting on behalf of the Presbytery, appointed a Special Administrative Review Committee (SARC) on June 7, 2018 to investigate certain irregularities and delinquencies of session and session moderator related to finances, personnel and property, including potential excessive use of church cash reserves for congregation operating expenses. The SARC provided a final report to CT in April 2019 recommending that an Administrative Commission be appointed for Raton, First with the full power and authority of the Presbytery of Santa Fe to take necessary action to inquire into and settle the difficulties uncovered by the SARC, including an excessive use of reserve funds each year resulting in the depletion of those funds of over \$147,000 with no plan in place or contemplation to reduce the use of those reserve funds; the failure of complete financial reports, including the full information regarding the extent to which reserve funds were being depleted, being regularly provided to the Session or the congregation; and no justification for a full-time pastoral position for this congregation.

The CT at a meeting conducted on April 6, 2019 moved for the appointment of an Administrative Commission at the June Presbytery meeting.

Motion to Authorize and Charge to Administrative Commission

Motion

The Presbytery of Santa Fe authorizes an Administrative Commission of 5 members, to be appointed by the Moderator in consultation with the Stated Clerk, to investigate, negotiate and take action, on behalf of the Presbytery, pursuant to G-3.0109b of the Book of Order, involving Raton, First in the following areas:

- A. the alleged excessive use of reserve funds each year resulting in the depletion of those funds of over \$147,000 with no plan in place or contemplation to reduce the use of those reserve funds;
- B. the failure of complete financial reports, including full information regarding the extent to which reserve funds were being depleted, being regularly provided to the Session or the congregation; and,
- C. any potential justification for a full-time pastoral position to continue for this congregation.

Report #4e

Charge and Authority

- 1. The Administrative Commission has the power to interview any person, including the pastor, involved with Raton, First, either in the past or the present time.
- 2. The Administrative Commission is instructed by the Presbytery to start the process with attempts at open communication and neutral conversation with the Session, the pastor and the congregation of Raton, First seeking a negotiated resolution of these issues.
- 3. The Administrative Commission has the power to participate in session meetings, including any executive session of the Session.
- 4. The Administrative Commission has the power to order full and complete financial reports of assets and liabilities and income and expenses for the present and past years for Raton, First and provide such full and complete financial reports to the Session and congregation.
- 5. The Administrative Commission has the power to exercise original jurisdiction, or full power and responsibility, over Raton, First, pursuant to G-3.0303e of the Book of Order, with the full power of session in order to call for a congregational meeting to discuss and decide the continuing pastoral position for the congregation or any other action that the Administrative Commission feels is appropriate, including the power to approve or deny future operating expenses and expenditures or changes to the terms of call for the pastor position from full-time to part-time or other pastoral expense concessions.
- 6. The Administrative Commission has the power to initiate proceedings for dissolution of the installed pastoral relationship (but not for dissolution of the congregation), only after meeting with the congregation for the congregation to consider the matter and to consent, or decline to consent, to dissolution of the installed pastoral relationship, pursuant to G-2.0901 of the Book of Order, but SHALL NOT have the power to dissolve the installed pastoral relationship but only RECOMMEND such dissolution to the full Presbytery for deliberation and action.
- 7. The Administrative Commission shall keep a full record of its proceedings and decisions of the Administrative Commission shall be reported to the Stated Clerk of the Presbytery, pursuant to G-3.0109b of the Book of Order, and the Administrative Commission shall report as to its progress at each stated meeting of the Presbytery.
- 8. After a period of discernment with the pastor, Session and the congregation, the Administrative Commission may recommend any other next steps to the Presbytery, including any recommendation to dissolve the congregation.

The Commission on Preparation for Ministry moves: That under the provisions of G-2.0610, the Presbytery of Santa Fe permit an alternate means of examination in biblical exegesis for candidate Patrick Kiptum. And that the presbytery give permission to CPM to set up and administer the examination.

Rationale: This is being brought to the presbytery by the Commission on Ministry because it requires a 3/4 "supermajority" vote of the presbytery.

According to G-2.0610: "If a presbytery judges that there are good and sufficient reasons why a candidate should not be required to satisfy the requirements of G-2.0607d (standard ordination exams), it shall approve by three-fourths vote some alternate means by which to ascertain the readiness of the candidate for ministry in the areas covered by the standard ordination examinations. A full account of the reasons for any waiver or alternate means to ascertain readiness shall be included in the minutes of the presbytery...."

Your Commission on Preparation for Ministry believes there are good and sufficient reasons. Patrick is a native of Kenya, and English is a second language for him. He has passed all of the other ordination exams. He has taken the written exegesis exam twice, and not passed, primarily due issues of English composition. He wishes to do an oral exam. Members of CPM have reviewed his previous exams and the Commission, without dissent, supports providing the alternate means.

Statement of Faith Rev. Margaret Crowl March 20, 2019

I believe in one God, traditionally named in three persons as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. God created the world and all that is in it. Humankind, male and female, was created in God's own image to be in loving fellowship with God. There also exists in the universe a force we call evil. God gave humankind free will to choose good or evil. As a human race, we have constantly rebelled against God, sought our own way, and rejected God's perfect love and grace. That rebellion brought about a condition of separation of God which is sometimes called sin.

The history of our faith, up until the present day, has been the story of God's many attempts to bring us back into fellowship in spite of our continuing rebellion. Throughout history, God called leaders, prophets, judges, and kings, who guided and governed the people. God gave them commandments and laws to help them worship and live peaceably with each other. Accounts of God's mighty acts, important events, words of worship and praise, as well as stories and parables were passed orally from generation to generation, and later written down. These accounts are recorded for us in the Bible, in the Old and New Testaments. We say that the Bible is God's inspired Word, which it is. However, I believe that the Bible also reflects the humanity, time, and culture of those who wrote down the words. Understanding of the Bible is enabled both by tools of modern scholarship and the inspiration of the Holy Spirit. Within the Reformed tradition of the Christian faith, reading and proclaiming God's Word claim a central place in our worship.

Even during ancient times, people believed that God would send a Messiah who would repair the separation and bring people back into fellowship with God. I believe that the Messiah came to Earth as God's Incarnate Son, Jesus Christ, also called Emmanuel, God With Us. Jesus was both fully human and fully divine. As he began his ministry, he was baptized by John in the Jordon River. Jesus formed a group of disciples, taught them new ways of understanding the old laws, and performed acts of justice, kindness, and mercy. As his teachings brought him an increasing number of followers, they also brought him into conflict with the leaders of that time. He was betrayed to the authorities by one of his own followers. As Jesus knew he was about to be put to death, he shared a Last Supper with his disciples. He gave them bread and wine, and told them that these elements were to remind them of his body and blood that would be broken and shed for them. He commanded them to remember him whenever they ate bread and drank wine.

After a sham trial, Jesus was put to death by crucifixion. Christians traditionally believe that Christ's death was necessary to satisfy God's judgment against human sins; that Jesus took upon himself the punishment we deserved. I believe more strongly that

Christ's death was necessary to prove God's love for us. Nothing short of this, no teaching or action, could have convinced us that God truly loves us and is with us in times of human suffering.

Three days after he died, Jesus was raised from the dead and began making appearances to his followers. Christians today celebrate Easter as the day Christ rose from the dead. Although some believe that the resurrection is only a spiritual or existential event, I believe that it is a physical reality that happened as it is described in various Biblical accounts. Although we cannot ever fully understand its mystery, I believe that Jesus' death and resurrection was the ultimate victory of good over evil. Although it did not erase evil in the world, it made it possible for us to know that nothing can ever separate us from God's love in Jesus Christ. I believe in eternal life. God promised that all who believe in Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord will ultimately be united in God's House. It is a central tenant of our Reformed faith that we are saved by God's grace which we receive through faith. However, I also believe that faith without works is dead, and that we are called to be doers of the word and not only hearers.

After Jesus' death and resurrection, the Holy Spirit came forth in a new and powerful way. Jesus original disciples and followers and new believers were brought together to form the Church. They followed his teachings, spread the word, and brought others into fellowship. The church, then and now, observes the two Sacraments that Jesus gave, Baptism and The Lord's Supper. I was baptized at age thirteen when I was also confirmed. While I have always considered it a blessing that I can remember my baptism, I also believe that baptism is appropriate for children of Christian parents who intend to raise their child in the life of the church. The whole church shares responsibility for the baptized child's Christian nurture. The entire church family, including baptized children, and Christians of any church or denomination, come together at the Lord's Table to remember his sacrifice for us.

The church continues to call people to have faith in Jesus Christ, to become disciples, to share his Good News, and to continue his works of justice, love, and mercy in the world. The traditional creed says that Christ will come again to judge the quick and the dead. Jesus himself said he did not know the day or the hour. Therefore, we are called to watch and be ready. We are also called, both as individual believers and collectively through the church, to continue to preach the Word, and work for peace, justice, and reconciliation in the world.

Terry Buckman Statement of Faith

February 2019

To the Presbytery of Santa Fe

Report of the Special Administrative Review Committee for First Presbyterian Church, Raton

The SARC was appointed on June 7, 2018. During this time we have requested and received documentations regarding the issues under our as designated from the Coordinating Team, met with the pastor, Rev. John McGarey and communicated with him in person, by phone and email; met with the Session of FPC, Raton; and communicated with the clerk of the Session by email.

Our findings and recommendations regarding the issues listed in the authorizing letter are as follows:

- A. Authorizing resolution adopted by Coordinating Team June 7, 2018
 - 1. Irregularities and delinquencies of session and session moderator related to finances, personnel and property
 - 2. Listen, review, study and recommend actions as appropriate for the health and strength of the congregation
 - 3. Action is initiated in the spirit of accountability for the life and mission of the congregation and the mission and ministry of the presbytery
 - 4. Specific issues:
 - a. Financial reporting [including annual financial review (audit) of church finances and potential excessive use of church cash reserves for operating expenses to the presbytery

The SARC finds that, though there were a few of years in which annual financial reviews were not completed, this has been corrected and the documentation has been received by the SARC. The SARC finds, however, that since Rev. John McGarey was called as a full-time pastor there has been an excessive use of reserve funds each year resulting in the depletion of those funds of over \$147,000 with no plan in place or in contemplation to reduce the use of said funds. In fact, the Session is laying the groundwork to begin expending funds that had been previously restricted by the Session for mission, as well as money to be gained from the sale of property.

b. Regular conduct of congregational life including annual congregational meetings, congregational nominating committee, management of assets including endowments and church properties, financial reports and required corporate reports to governmental agencies

The SARC finds that FPC, Raton has had annual congregational meetings, however, neither the Session nor the congregation has been regularly provided with complete financial reports, including the full information regarding the extent to which reserve funds have been depleted. Annual meetings did receive reports of a nominating committee and elected elders according to the Book of Order. There was a delinquency in reports to governmental agencies, however this was corrected prior to the authorizing of the SARC.

c. Personnel, including justification of full-time pastoral position; training and supervision of church secretary; treasurer/ bookkeeper and volunteers

Training of church secretary and treasurer/bookkeeper has been sporadic, but no more so than is typical in a very small congregation. There have been no annual reviews of either the staff or the pastor that have been documented; again, not unusual in small congregations.

The SARC can find no justification for a full-time pastoral position in this congregation. We find no evidence of growth in either the ministry or the membership of the congregation, in fact, both have become smaller in the past four years. FPC, Raton participated in New Beginnings, developed a plan for a tutoring ministry to a local school, however when that school moved across town that plan was dropped and no action was taken to update the plan or to develop or implement any other outreach strategy. Quite frankly, with an "able-bodied" congregation of five, any such strategy would be quite limited.

The Commission on Ministry deals with several small congregations on the cusp between full and part time pastors. The chair of the SARC notes that when a congregation falls below 80 members it is rarely able to support a full-time call in its annual budget. As this congregation has continued to shrink, it is consistently in the red every month, up to an average of \$40,000 annually. Additionally, this brings up the risk of the IRS inurement prohibition which forbids "the use of the income or assets of a tax-exempt organization to directly or indirectly unduly benefit an individual or other person that has a close relationship with the organization or is able to exercise significant control over the organization."

The chair of the SARC was meeting with FPC, Raton when they received the bequest which allowed them to change Rev. McGarey's call from part-time to full-time. The statement was repeatedly made that this was in an effort to provide the pastor with more time for outreach to grow the congregation in numbers, stewardship and outreach. The SARC finds no evidence that this has been the case.

Additionally, SARC has requested an opportunity to meet with the congregation to provide our recommendations. This request has been unnecessarily delayed, with the pastor claiming that it will not be possible prior to a (requested) financial review, falsely claiming that the SARC had implied misappropriation of funds. Although several communications were given explaining that such was not the case and that we needed to meet with the congregation expeditiously, this has not been done.

Therefore the SARC for FPC, Raton respectfully recommends that the Presbytery of Santa Fe appoint an Administrative Commission for FPC, Raton with the full power and authority of the Presbytery of Santa Fe to take necessary action to inquire into and settle the difficulties therein.

Coordinating Team report, June 2019

The Coordinating Team has met three times since February of this year, including a retreat to review our existing structural design as a presbytery. The Presbytery of Santa Fe under our current design without an Executive Presbyter has been living and breathing for three years now.

Though we have progressed, learned, and achieved successes in our church, we have identified some holes in our current design. We propose to address issues as needed via a task force, which will assess how our design is meeting our needs. This assessment will provide an in-depth look and create solutions for moving forward in our presbytery with what we are currently using including our Bylaws and Standing Rules.

We will form this Design Task Force by our October presbytery meeting and have this task force work and report back to us in 2020. We will also address the presbytery's use of the Zia symbol in light of what we learned from the Doctrine of Discovery. This means we will plan to meet with Zia Pueblo in the near future.

We have been closely working with the Personnel Committee to find a new Administrator and an Administrative Assistant. The deadline for applications will be due by the end of this month. Needless to say, Sharon Yates has been extraordinary to our Presbytery.

Sharon will be missed even though she is right down the block. Her everyday presence and care and hard work in our church will be missed. Christin has also been an outstanding help and care in our church. God's blessings to both in their new endeavors. Keep us in your prayers as we look to gain a new perspective and outlook as we move forward in our good work.

ACTIONS TAKEN ON BEHALF OF PRESBYTERY

1) CT APPROVED the concept of a Peacemaking Travel Study Seminar to the Southwest and encouraged MNC to move forward in their planning.

- 2) CT APPROVED serving communion at the June and October 2019 and February 2020 presbytery meetings.
- 3) In the absence of a Standing Rule, CT directed the Moderator to appoint the members of two Administrative Commissions in reference to First Presbyterian Church in Raton and Camino de Vida in consultation with the Stated Clerk under the authority of G-3.0109b.
- 4) ADDED the following to the Rules of Decorum to all future Presbytery meeting dockets: Any docket time allocated to a presbytery entity should not be used for fundraising purposes, capital or otherwise, unless approved by CT prior to that presbytery meeting.
- 5) APPROVED referring the amendment to the Standing Rules (Stated Clerk's Report) to the Presbytery and waiving the second reading of the amendment to the Standing Rules. Per Standing Rules (lines 769-771):
- Unless the Coordinating Team deems otherwise, all proposed amendments shall be presented to the Presbytery in writing as new business for a first reading, and shall then be voted upon at the subsequent meeting.
- 6) APPROVED a Presbyterian Mission Agency Restricted Grant Application from White Rock, and GRANTED authority to the Stated Clerk to sign it and send it on to the Synod.

MISSION NETWORKING COMMITTEE REPORT TO PRESBYTERY – JUNE 2019 Lorelei Kay and Roger Scott Powers, Co-Chairs

The Coordinating Team tasked the MNC with helping Santa Fe Presbytery continue the conversation about the Doctrine of Discovery and what it means for us today. To that end, we invited Native Americans in our Presbytery to come to the MNCs first meeting of the year on Jan. 14, 2019. Stella and Jim Webster, Peggy Barnet, Lou Ann Johnson, Georgia Pedro, and Leona Mark participated in that MNC meeting, along with Jane Stringfellow and Susan Quass. Together, we watched a 14-minute video on the Doctrine of Discovery produced by the Episcopal Church and had a very rich 90-minute conversation about how the MNC might help the Presbytery continue the conversation. Subsequently, a Doctrine of Discovery (DOD) Planning Team was formed (Nelson Capitan, Lorelei Kay, June Lorenzo, Roger Powers, Stella and Jim Webster). The DOD Planning Team met at the Laguna Presbyterian Church in Casa Blanca on Feb. 2 and Mar. 9. Those planning meetings have borne much fruit:

- We showed "Healing the Wounds of Privilege" before the Feb. 23 Presbytery Meeting.
- We developed an Annotated List of Recommended Resources for Congregations, which is now posted on the Presbytery's website.
- We organized "Continuing Conversations on the Doctrine of Discovery: A Daytrip to Gallup," on Sat., May 18, which drew 47 participants from 6 congregations, the Synod of the Southwest, and Ghost Ranch.
- We have made plans for Tewa Women United to give a presentation on intergenerational trauma at the October Presbytery at Ghost Ranch.
- We are partnering with the Synod of the Southwest and the Presbyterian Peacemaking Program to organize a Travel Study Seminar of "Native Lands of the Southwest: The Doctrine of Discovery and its Legacy Today" for Spring 2021.

NOTE: The Sessions of Second P.C. & St. Andrew P.C. have both repudiated the Doctrine of Discovery. Has yours? Please let us know. And tell us if you would like our assistance.

In addition to the MNC's work on the Doctrine of Discovery, we have also done the following since the beginning of the year:

- Awarded \$1,000 to NM Interfaith Power & Light in support of its continuing collaboration with congregations in the Presbytery.
- Promoted visits of PCUSA Mission Co-Workers Burkhard Paetzold (March) and Sarah Henken (May) to the Presbytery.
- Facilitated a meeting of Presbytery leadership with Samuel Son, Manager of Diversity & Reconciliation in the Exec. Director's Office of Presbyterian Mission Agency, on Apr. 29.
- Awarded \$750 to Second Presbyterian Church in support of its project providing transitional housing for transgender asylum seekers being released from the Cibola Detention Center.

Auditor's Responsibility

Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. In our opinion, the information is fairly stated in all material respects in relation to the financial statement as a whole.

Report on Summarized Comparative Information

NOTE A – NATURE OF OPERATIONS

The Presbytery of Santa Fe (Presbytery) is a religious, charitable, non-profit organization, which began operations in 1973 and serves as a governing body over the Presbyterian churches in a geographic area in New Mexico. The Presbytery is governed by the Synod of the Southwest (Synod), which is in turn governed by the Presbyterian Church (USA).

NOTE B – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements of the Presbytery have been prepared on the modified cash basis of accounting. Consequently, under this method of accounting, certain revenues and the related assets are recognized when received rather than when earned and certain expenses and the related liabilities are recognized when paid rather than when the obligation is incurred. That basis differs from generally accepted accounting principles primarily because the Presbytery has not recognized accounts receivable from third parties and accounts payable to vendors or their related effects in the accompanying financial statements. The inclusion of these amounts would have an unknown impact on the accompanying financial statements and potentially could materially affect the financial position of the Presbytery as disclosed in those financial statements.

The significant accounting policies followed are described below to enhance the usefulness of the financial statements to the reader.

1) Classes of Net Assets:

The Presbytery follows FASB ASC 958-205. Under FASB ASC 958-205, the Presbytery is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted net assets, and permanently restricted net assets.

Unrestricted and Board Designated Net Assets

Unrestricted amounts are those net assets currently available at the discretion of the Board for use in the Presbytery's programs, and those resources invested in land, buildings and equipment.

Temporarily Restricted Net Assets

Temporarily restricted net assets result from contributions and other inflows of assets whose use by the Presbytery is limited by donor-imposed stipulations that expire by passage of time or can be fulfilled and removed by actions of the Presbytery pursuant to those stipulations.

Permanently Restricted Net Assets

Permanently restricted net assets result from contributions and other inflows of assets whose use by the Presbytery is limited by donor-imposed stipulations that cannot be removed by actions of the Presbytery. Permanently restricted net assets are investments in the Presbyterian Foundation Permanent Pooled Life Income Fund.

2) Revenue Recognition:

Contributions received are recorded as unrestricted, temporarily restricted, or permanently restricted support, depending on the existence and/or nature of any donor restrictions.

All donor-restricted support is reported as an increase in temporarily or permanently restricted net assets, depending on the nature of the restriction. When a restriction expires (that is, when a stipulated time restriction ends, or purpose restriction is accomplished), temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets and reported in the statements of activities as net assets released from restrictions.

3) Fair Value of Measurements:

Fair Value Measurements – The Presbytery has adopted ASC 820-10 which provides a framework for measuring fair value and requires additional disclosure about use of fair value measurements in an effort to make the measurement more consistent and comparable.

As defined in ASC 820-10, fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. In determining fair value, the Presbytery uses various methods including market, income, and cost approaches. Based on these approaches, the Presbytery often utilizes certain assumptions that market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability, including assumptions about risk and or the risks inherent in the inputs to the valuation technique. These inputs can be readily observable, market corroborated, or generally unobservable inputs. The Presbytery utilized valuation techniques that maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. Based on the observability of the inputs used in the valuation techniques the Presbytery is required to provide the following information according to the fair value hierarchy. The fair value hierarchy ranks the quality and reliability of the information used to determine fair values. Financial assets and liabilities carried at fair value will be classified and disclosed in one of the following three categories:

Level 1 – Valuations for assets and liabilities traded in active exchange markets, such as the New York Stock Exchange. Level 1 also includes U.S. Treasury and federal agency securities and federal agency mortgage-backed securities, which are traded by dealers of brokers in active markets. Valuations are obtained from readily available pricing sources for market transactions involving identical assets or liabilities.

Level 2 – Valuations for assets and liabilities traded in less active dealer or broker markets. Valuations are obtained from third-party pricing services for identical or similar assets or liabilities.

Level 3 — Valuations for assets and liabilities that are derived from other valuation methodologies, including option pricing models, discounted cash flow models and similar techniques, and not based on market exchange, dealer, or broker traded transactions. Level 3 valuations incorporate certain assumptions and projections in determining the fair value assigned to such assets or liabilities.

Following is a description of valuation methodologies used for assets and liabilities recorded at fair value:

Mutual funds and fixed income balances – based on quoted market prices.

Investments and loan program and charitable remainder trust – based on inputs derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

4) <u>Cash and Cash Equivalents:</u>

For purposes of the statement of assets, liabilities and net assets — modified cash basis and the statement of cash flows - modified cash basis, cash and cash equivalents consist of cash and other highly liquid resources, such as investments in certificates of deposit and money market funds, with an original maturity of three months or less when purchased.

5) Investments:

Investments in marketable securities with readily determinable fair values and all investments in debt securities are reported at their fair values based on quoted prices in active markets (all Level 1 measurements) in the statement of revenues, expenditures and changes in net assets – modified cash basis. Unrealized gains and losses are included in the change in net assets. Investment income and gains restricted by donors are reported as increases in unrestricted net assets if the restrictions are met (either by passage of time or by use) in the reporting period in which the income and gains are recognized.

6) Property & Equipment:

The Presbytery capitalizes all expenditures in excess of \$5,000 for property and equipment at cost. Contributed property and equipment, if no appraisal exists at the time of the donation, the notice of value from the County Assessor of the county in which the property is located shall be the amount recorded in the books. Property and equipment are carried at cost or, if donated, at the approximate fair value at the date of donation. If donors stipulate how long the assets must be used, the contributions are recorded as restricted support. In the absence of such stipulations, contributions of property and equipment are recorded as unrestricted support. Routine repairs and maintenance are expensed as incurred. Depreciation is computed using the straight-line method over the assets estimated useful life.

7) <u>Impairment of Long-Lived Assets:</u>

The Presbytery accounts for long-lived assets in accordance with the provisions of FASB ASC 360-10 and subsections. FASB ASC 360-10 requires that long-lived assets be reviewed for impairment whenever events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying amount of an asset may not be recoverable. Recoverability of assets to be held and used is measured by a comparison of the carrying amount of an asset to future undiscounted net cash flows expected to be generated by the asset. If such assets are considered to be impaired, the impairment to be recognized is measured by the amount by which the carrying amount of the assets exceeds the fair value of the assets. Assets to be disposed of are reported at the lower of the carrying amount or the fair value less costs to sell. Management does not believe impairment indicators are present as of December 31, 2017.

8) Revenue Recognition:

The Presbytery primarily receives its revenue in the form of contributions from churches and individual donors. Contributions received are recorded as unrestricted, temporarily restricted, or permanently restricted support, depending on the existence and nature of any donor restrictions. Support that is not restricted by the donor is reported as an increase in unrestricted net assets. All other donor restricted support is reported as an increase in temporarily or permanently restricted net assets, depending on the nature of the restriction. When a restriction expires (that is when a stipulated time restriction ends or purpose restriction is accomplished), temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets and reported in the statement of revenues, expenditures and changes in net assets-modified cash basis as net assets released from restrictions. Temporarily restricted contributions whose restrictions are met in the same reporting period are recorded as unrestricted contributions.

Gifts of land, buildings, equipment and other long-lived assets are also reported as unrestricted revenue and net assets, unless subject to time restrictions or other donor stipulations. Absent explicit donor stipulations for the length of time long-lived assets must be held, expirations of restrictions resulting in reclassification of temporarily restricted net assets as unrestricted net assets are reported when the long-lived assets are placed in service.

Contribution income is recorded when cash is received or when ownership of donated assets is transferred. Expenses are recorded when paid in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting.

9) Fund Accounting:

To ensure observance of limitations and restrictions placed on the use of resources available to the Presbytery, the accounts of the Presbytery are maintained in accordance with the principles of fund accounting. This is a procedure by which resources for various purposes are classified for accounting and reporting purposes into funds established according to their nature and purpose. Separate accounts are maintained for each fund; in the accompanying financial statements, funds that have similar characteristics have been recorded and reported by fund group.

10) <u>Functional Expenses:</u>

For the year ended December 31, 2017, the costs of providing the various programs and other activities have been summarized on a functional basis in the statement of functional expenses. Accordingly, certain costs have been allocated among the programs and supporting services benefited.

11) Income Taxes:

The Presbytery is exempt through a group exemption with the Presbyterian Church (USA) from income tax under Section 501 (c) (3) of the U.S. Internal Revenue Code and comparable state law, and contributions to it are tax deductible within the limitations prescribed by the code. The Presbyter has been classified as a publicly supported organization that is not a private foundation under Section509 (a) of the code.

Contributions to the Presbytery qualify for the charitable contributions deduction to the extent provided by Section 170 of the Internal Revenue Code. No unrelated business income taxes were due for the year. The Presbytery is not required to file Form 990 or any other type of annual IRS tax form. Currently, the 2014, 2015 and 2016 tax years are open and subject to examination by the Internal Revenue Service and New Mexico Taxation and Revenue Department. However, the Presbytery is not currently under audit nor has the Presbytery been contacted by any of these jurisdictions.

The Presbytery has adopted the provisions of FASB ASC 740-10. Under ASC 740-10, an organization must recognize the tax benefit/liability associated with any uncertain tax positions taken by the organization when it is more likely than not the position will be sustained by review of the taxing authority. An analysis performed by management during the year ended December 31, 2017 of the Presbytery's tax positions revealed no positions that met the requirements for disclosure as identified by ASC 740-10.

12) Use of Estimates:

The process of preparing financial statements—modified cash basis, a comprehensive basis of accounting other than generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

13) Other matters:

All gains and losses arising from the sale, collection, or other disposition of investments and other noncash assets are accounted for in the fund that owned the assets. Ordinary income from investments, receivables, and the like is accounted for in the fund owning the assets.

14) Comparative Information:

The financial statements include certain prior year summarized comparative information in total but not by net asset class. Such information does not include sufficient detail to constitute a presentation in conformity with the modified cash basis of accounting. Accordingly, such information should be read in conjunction with the Presbytery's financial statements for the year ended December 31, 2016, from which the summarized information was derived.

Certain accounts in the prior year financial statements may have been reclassified for comparative purposes to conform with the presentation in the current year-end financial statements. Net assets are unchanged due to these reclassifications.

The Presbytery maintains its cash balances in one financial institution located in New Mexico. The balances are insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) up to \$250,000. As of December 31, 2017 and 2016 all of the Presbytery's cash balances were covered by FDIC insurance. The Presbytery maintains its cash balances with high quality financial institutions which the organization believes limits any custodial credit risk to an acceptable level.

NOTE E – CHARITABLE REMAINDER TRUST

Charitable remainder trusts represent the Presbytery's interest in various irrevocable trusts held by the Presbyterian Foundation. In accordance with FASB ASC 958-300-14, the interests have been measured at fair value by using the fair value of the assets contributed to the trust.

The Presbytery is the beneficiary of three perpetual charitable trusts held by the Presbyterian Foundation. Each of the trusts is irrevocable with the corpus of the trust being permanently restricted. The Presbytery is entitled to a portion of the annual income earned on the trusts accounts in accordance with the terms of the individual trusts. The income received from the trusts is potentially purpose restricted based on donor stipulations. The corpus portion of the trusts is inaccessible by the Presbytery, so it is reflected in the associated financial statements as permanently restricted. Changes in the value of the trusts have been reported in the statement of revenues, expenditures and changes in net assets-modified cash basis as increases/decreases in permanently restricted net assets.

NOTE G – DUE TO AFFILIATED ORGANIZATIONS

The Presbytery receives funds under an obligation to remit to various affiliated organizations outside and within the Presbyterian Church organization and accordingly, is reflected as a liability in the accompanying statement of assets, liabilities and net assets – modified cash basis.

NOTE H - LEASES - RELATED PARTY

On June 1, 2016 the Presbytery entered into a five-year lease for office space with First Presbyterian Church of Albuquerque for \$600 a month. First Presbyterian Church of Albuquerque is a member of the Presbytery.

Rent expense for the year ended December 31, 2017 was \$7,234.

The Presbytery leases property in the Sandia Mountains to Sandia Mountain Retreats under a five-year lease for \$1 a year. The lease was renewed for five years in 2016.

The Presbytery has also entered into a lease with the County of Rio Arriba for the Truchas Volunteer Fire Department building and a senior citizens center. The lease was dated February 2005 and is for a term of 40 years with a rent payment of \$1 a year.

The Presbytery leases building to the Truchas Service Center, Inc., Truchas, New Mexico. The lease was dated January 1, 1995 and is for a term of 25 years with a rent payment of \$1 a year.

The Presbytery leases property and building to Health Center of Northern New Mexico in Espanola, New Mexico. The lease dated June 30, 1993 is for term of 30 years with a rent payment of \$1 a year.

NOTE I – COMMITMENTS AND CONTINGENCIES

<u>Mortgage Guarantees</u> – The Presbytery is a guarantor on mortgages existing between the Presbyterian Church (USA) and congregations for church sites within its geographical area. Such guarantees at December 31, 2017 and 2016 totaled approximately \$832,444 and \$886,688, respectively, representing seven churches.

NOTE J – CLASSIFICATIONS OF NET ASSETS

<u>Unrestricted Board Designated</u> – The Presbytery maintains board-designated funds for specific purposes. Board-designated funds are classified as a type of unrestricted net assets. The Presbytery's board designated funds are listed on page 18.

Temporarily Restricted

The Presbytery maintains donor-designated funds for specific purposes. Donor designated funds are classified as temporarily restricted net assets. The Presbytery's donor designated funds are listed on page 17.

Permanently Restricted

The Presbytery reports certain permanently restricted amounts that cannot be accessed by the Presbytery due to explicit donor restrictions. Permanently restricted net assets are investments in the Presbyterian Foundation Permanent Pooled Life Income Fund.

NOTE K – ECONOMIC DEPENDENCY

Contributions are the Presbytery's primary source of support, making up 94% and 94% of all revenues and support during the fiscal year ended December 31, 2017 and 2016, respectively. The Presbytery expects these contributions to continue into the foreseeable future. However, if a significant portion of these funds are not continued, the Presbytery's ability to continue all programs would be diminished.

NOTE L - PENSION AND HEALTH PLAN

Eligible employees of the Presbytery participate in an employer-paid, defined contribution pension and healthcare plan administered by the Board of Pensions of the Presbyterian Church (USA). Contributions and costs are determined as 36.5% of each employee's compensation (11% related to the pension plan and 24.5% related to the healthcare plan and 1% related to death and disability benefits). Highmark Blue Cross/Blue Shield administers the healthcare plan.

Eligible employees of the Presbytery may also participate in a retirement savings plan available through the Board of Pensions of the Presbyterian Church (USA) and administered by the Fidelity Group of Investments.

Under terms of both plans, pastors who work at least 20 hours per week (1,000 hours per year) are automatically enrolled in the defined contribution pension/healthcare plan and may choose to make contributions to the retirement savings account, once they have completed a 90-day probationary period which begins on their first date of employment. Any employee can choose to make contributions to the retirement savings account.

Contributions made on behalf of the Presbytery's employees for both retirement and employee benefits for the years ended December 31, 2017 and 2016 were \$41,305 and \$48,257, respectively.

NOTE M – RESTATEMENT OF NET ASSETS

Beginning net assets were restated to reflect the donation of property received by the Presbytery in prior years that had not been recorded. As a result of this restatement, beginning net assets were increased by \$827,603 to \$2,909,952.

NOTE N – SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Subsequent events are events or transactions that occur after the statement of assets, liabilities and net assets – modified cash basis date but before the financial statements are issued. The Presbytery recognizes in the financial statements the effects of all subsequent events that provide additional evidence about conditions that existed at the date of the statement of assets, liabilities and net asset – modified cash basis, including the estimates inherent in the process of preparing the financial statements. The Presbytery's financial statements do not recognize subsequent events that provide evidence about conditions that did not exist at the date of the statement of assets, liabilities and net assets – modified cash basis, but arose after the statement of assets, liabilities and net assets – modified cash basis date and before financial statements are available to be issued. The Presbytery has evaluated subsequent events through March 26, 2019 which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.
